

Mossman Gorge Microgrid project has plenty to celebrate as 2025 draws to a close

We're building a more resilient energy future for Mossman Gorge

Construction of the Mossman Gorge Microgrid is progressing well, both on site in Far North Queensland and in the Pacific Energy workshops in Western Australia.

On site at Mossman Gorge, our civil contractors have levelled the site for the foundations and are well progressed installing conduits for the electrical cables that will connect the microgrid to the electricity network – see figure 1.

These early works are a crucial part of preparing the site for the arrival and installation of the microgrid in the new year.

Meanwhile, over in the Pacific Energy workshops, fabrication of the microgrid infrastructure is also well advanced.

The team is moving steadily through the build phase, ensuring each component meets the design, safety and performance standards – see figure 2.

Once fabrication is complete in the new year, our Ergon Energy microgrid and battery specialists will undertake a series of comprehensive tests in the workshop.

These checks ensure the system is operating correctly before it's transported across the country to Mossman Gorge for installation and connection to the local electricity network.

Bama Brave, Strong and Busy: Mossman Gorge kids bring community motto to life.

Our latest community-led activity is already bursting with colour, culture and creativity.

Over the past few weeks, we've kicked off a vibrant **Street Art initiative**, inviting local kids to help transform four power poles beside the community footy field into bright, meaningful artworks inspired by the people who live there.

The designs celebrate the Mossman Gorge community motto: Bama - Brave, Strong and Busy. Each pole draws on ideas generated locally, ensuring the artwork reflects community identity, pride and spirit.

In a special touch, we've incorporated some of the scratch art designs created by kids during our recent school holiday program. Their artwork - full of imagination and storytelling - has been woven into the designs at the top of the poles, giving the children a real sense of ownership and excitement as their creations come to life.

The first pole is now finished and already turning heads. It features the Aboriginal flag imprinted with community handprints, symbolising unity, culture and strength.

The remaining three poles will showcase land and sea animals, along with colourful fruit illustrations that reinforce the community's healthy eating program.

A big thanks goes to Peter, Chantel and Anastasia, who will continue working alongside the kids throughout the school holidays to bring the remaining poles to life. Their support and enthusiasm are helping the kids to express themselves and contribute to a long-lasting project in the community.

We can't wait to see how the remaining poles evolve and to celebrate the kids' hard work when we're back in community again!
